### MAN FOUND NOT GUILTY IN WEST SIDE SHOOTING

An Oakmont Place man serving a prison term on a weapons conviction was found not guilty Friday of the shooting of another man near Grover Cleveland High School last April 14.

Shaun "Rodshaun" Black, 20, who did not testify or present any alibi witnesses, was found not guilty by a jury in the shooting of Shantel Evans, 23, during a robbery attempt at York and 14th streets about 3 p.m. April 14.

The verdict came at the end of a four-day trial before Erie County Judge Michael F. Pietruszka.

Black, currently in Elmira Correctional Facility, has no chance for release before Feb. 25, 2008. He faces another trial on bail-jumping charges linked to the weapons case, which put him in prison last December.

Evans, currently serving a five-year prison term for assault, testified Wednesday that he still has a bullet in his pelvic area. He said he was shot while drinking rum and smoking pot with a friend.

Evans testified he was reaching into his pocket to pull out money that he claimed Black had demanded when he was shot once.
